

Internet/Wi-Fi Use, Filtering, and Student-Owned Devices Agreement

Technology provides enhanced educational opportunities to all students and can tremendously benefit the learning environment, but ER9 requires responsible behavior and ethical behavior on the part of all digital users. Students and guests who wish to access the Internet and those who choose to use their own devices agree to adhere to ER9's Acceptable Use Policy and all related Board policies, and also acknowledge the following:

- Access to the Internet from ER9 resources is reserved for educational purposes.
- Student-owned devices are to be used appropriately.
- Students and guests will access the internet using the approved ER9 Wi-Fi.
- Students and guests will not attempt to bypass security and filtering systems.
- While the filters employed by ER9 are comprehensive, students and guests must take all reasonable precautions to avoid inappropriate content.
- ER9 may collect and examine devices it suspects of causing significant disruptions or is the source of a virus.
- Take precautions to protect personal information (phone number, home address, passwords).
- Currently, printing from personal devices is not permitted.
- ER9 cannot guarantee access to electrical outlets or provide chargers for student-owned devices. Therefore, students should charge devices prior to bringing to school each day.
- Students are responsible for their personal devices at all times. The school is not responsible for theft or damage of a personal device. It is also the students' and/or parents' responsibility to maintain and repair personal devices.
- Ultimately, it will be up to the teacher to decide if technology is the correct choice for a particular task.

I have read and fully understand the ER9 Acceptable Use Policy and this agreement. I further understand that computer use in ER9 is a privilege, not a right, and that right can be revoked if it is abused.
